A message from Mrs. Denham

We have so enjoyed seeing week 2 of Christmas jumper week – the variety of jumpers is quite astonishing and the school is a blaze of colour! The classrooms are starting to look very festive and the children are starting to prepare for the various Christmas activities we mentioned in previous emails – including Christmas lunch with handmade place mats, Christmas swop shop, Christingle, making a special card for someone in their class and making a present to bring home. I am so grateful to all the staff for being so willing to go the extra mile for your children during such a busy and difficult time. They are just so dedicated and wonderful.

We are also so grateful to the amazing PTA for all they are doing to help make Christmas at our school so special for the children too. They have been so understanding and supportive and we can't wait to see the gorgeous school T towels when they arrive.

Don't forget the children can wear their Christmas jumpers on Christmas lunch day too!

Christmas swop shop – Monday December 14th at 9.30am. Parents may send in any small donations of presents. **Due to COVID restrictions, donations will ONLY be accepted on Thursday 10th & Friday 11th December.** A tray will be left on the doorstep of the main entrance for donations and they will be put in the back of the hall over the weekend to be isolated for 72hrs. On swop shop day, we will ensure the children will hand sanitise before and after the swop shop. They will only touch the item they choose as their present. They will put it in a **decorated white paper bag** and then take it home the same day. Parents can then isolate the item for 72 hours, in line with all present quidance.

Free School Meals over the Christmas Holidays

If you are entitled to free school meals, please look out for a letter or email from Devon County Council on or after the 8th December next week, for details of how to access your vouchers or an alternative food box. On or after the 8th December you should receive a unique code per child. Each code can be used once on a website call 'Hawk Select' to redeem your voucher/s to the value of £30.00 per child (£15.00 per week for the two weeks of school holidays) for Sainsbury's, Tesco, Morrison's, Asda, M&S Food and Waitrose.

Many parents may be entitled to claim for free school meals. This is based on the benefits you may receive

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support (IS)
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance (IBJSA)
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (IRESA)
- The quaranteed element of Pension Credit

- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs, that does not exceed £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (the payment someone receives for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

If you are in receipt of any of these benefits, we ask you please to apply through the Devon County Council Citizens Portal $\frac{\text{https://oneonline.devon.gov.uk/CCSCitizenPortal_LIVE/en?ReturnUrl=\%2FCCSCitizenPortal_live}{\text{https://oneonline.devon.gov.uk/CCSCitizenPortal_LIVE/en?ReturnUrl=\%2FCCSCitizenPortal_live}}$

For each child registered we receive additional funding of £1,320.00 for our school. Please see letter attached for more information.

Severe weather conditions and the closure of School

I thought I would take the opportunity to update you on the procedures for the closure of the school in bad weather.

- 1. We will send out a message on Bratton Fleming CP School Facebook page as soon as we know the weather conditions, we will also put a message on the Bratton Fleming PTA Facebook page and we will also email you.
- 2. You can register with Devon County Council school closures, alert me -stay up to date. The email link is: https://new.devon.gov.uk/schools/closure/

They will then alert you if the school is closed.

- 3. Listen to Heart Radio.
- 4. If you are unsure, as a last resort please telephone either Bratton Fleming school on 01598 710337. However, if we cannot get into school to man the phone please try Holywell School on 01271 345908, they may be open to assist you. We will always have staff, if possible, to answer the telephone.

We will always try, wherever possible, to remain open. Alternatively, it may be safer to open school later than normal.

Individual families should assess the risk posed by their journey to school and make their own decision. Many families who live close to the school will have a different level of risk to those who have much more complex travel arrangements. Let's hope that we have a trouble-free winter!
