## Severe weather conditions and the closure of School

Procedures for the closure of the school in bad weather.

- 1. We will send out a message on the Bratton Fleming Primary School Facebook page as soon as we know the weather conditions, we will also put a message on the Bratton Fleming Facebook page, Bratton Fleming website page and we will also email you.
- 2. You can register with Devon County Council school closures, alert me -stay up to date. The email link is: <a href="https://new.devon.gov.uk/schools/closure/">https://new.devon.gov.uk/schools/closure/</a> They will then alert you if the school is closed.
- 3. Listen to Radio Devon.
- 4. If you are unsure, as a last resort please telephone either Bratton Fleming Primary school on (01598 710337). However, if we cannot get into school to man the phone please try Holywell C of E School on 01271 345908 they may be open to assist you. We will always have staff, if possible, to answer the telephone.

We will always try, wherever possible, to remain open. Alternatively, it may be safer to open school later than normal.

Individual families should assess the risk posed by their journey to school and make their own decision. Many families who live close to the school will have a different level of risk to those who have much more complex travel arrangements.
