

Pre-School

This week at preschool we have been talking all about Easter and still learning about springtime. We have had a variety of Easter themed activities such as balancing plastic eggs onto tubes, and we even had magnets in eggs to see if we could find the magnetic ones using our magnets. On the carpet we've had a great time working together building with the wooden blocks, creating castles and ramps for the cars. We have been potato printing Easter egg patterns and creating egg shaped sun catchers and we have been exploring our Easter themed tuff tray with bird seeds, shredded paper, eggs, lambs and bunnies - this created opportunity for lots of imaginative play. Outside we have been practicing our gross motor skills, doing lots of balancing and climbing using crates and planks of wood. This really helped build the children's confidence as they had to work together to build an obstacle course and practice their balancing skills, some of the children kindly helped one another as they were trying to balance along the course.
