Nick Butter - Running The World 196 Challenge Fundraising

Since January, Class Taw have been following an athlete from Bristol called Nick Butter who is currently taking part in a challenge called 'Running the World 196'. This involves Nick running a marathon in every country in the world over the next 16 months. His motivation for this is that he hopes to make people more aware of the disease and to also raise £250,000 for Prostate Cancer UK , a charity that has helped his close friend deal with this disease. The children have been following him through his social media, learning about the different countries & cultures he has experienced so far and even had the chance to video call him on a couple of occasions. Over the last few weeks, the rest of the school have been introduced to Nick's challenge and during assemblies have been keeping track on how Nick is doing.

After speaking to our children and hearing about how inspiring his challenge is to them, Nick has kindly agreed to visit the school to run with the children and hold an assembly. This will be on Friday 20th April and all parents are welcome to attend the assembly. Details to follow nearer the time
